### Upcoming Levies Vote on February 9th



Next month Seattle voters will be asked to preserve funding for our 52,000 students and their 98 Seattle public schools.

The three-year **Operations Levy** provides over 25% of the basic

funds needed to operate Seattle's public schools --money that benefits every one of our students that the State does not provide.

The six-year Buildings, Technology and Academics/Athletics IV (8TA IV) Capital Levy will provide funds for upgrades and renovations of our aging school facilities on a planned and predictable timeline to help ensure a safe, secure teaching and learning environment.

A team from the city will visit Beacon Hill in the next few weeks to interview our educators about performance measures and how our intervention programs are going. <u>Click here</u> to read some frequently asked questions about the levies.
